CRITICAL TOOL RELATED PRECAUTIONS

2. Use a $\geq 10A$ outdoor, cold-weather cord. Keep clear of auger. Do not use in wet conditions or with damaged cords.
3. Clear debris. Do not aim shovel at people, vehicles, or windows. Keep others at a safe distance.

EXTENSION CORD SAFETY



When using an extension cord with your electric tool refer to the following table to determine the required AWG wire size. Before using your tool make sure the power cord and extension cord are in good working conditions. Make repairs or replacements before using the tool. Only use extension cords that are rated for outdoor use.



WARNING: Consult the extension guide table to ensure the correct extension cord is used with the tool. Use of an extension cord that is insufficiently rated for the tool may result in tool under-performance, overheating, fire, and tool failure.



WARNING: Keep the extension cord clear of the working area. Position the cord so that it will not get caught on the workpiece, tools or any other obstructions while you are working with the power tool.

Make sure any extension cord used with this tool is in good condition. When using an extension cord, be sure to use one of heavy enough gauge to carry the current the tool will draw. An undersized cord will cause a drop in voltage resulting in loss of power and overheating.

The table below shows the correct size to use according to cord length and name plate ampere rating. If in doubt, use the next heavier gauge. The smaller the gauge number, the heavier the cord.

Be sure your extension cord is properly wired and in good condition. Always replace a damaged extension cord or have it repaired by a qualified electrician before using it. Protect your extension cord from sharp objects, excessive heat and damp or wet areas.

Use a separate electrical circuit for your power tools. This circuit must not be less than 14 gauge wire and should be protected with either a 15AMP time delayed fuse or circuit breaker. Before connecting the power tool to the power source, make sure the switch is in the OFF position and the power source is the same as indicated on the nameplate. Running at lower voltage will damage the motor.

To reduce the risk of disconnect of tool from the extension cord during operation. Make a knot as shown in Fig. 1

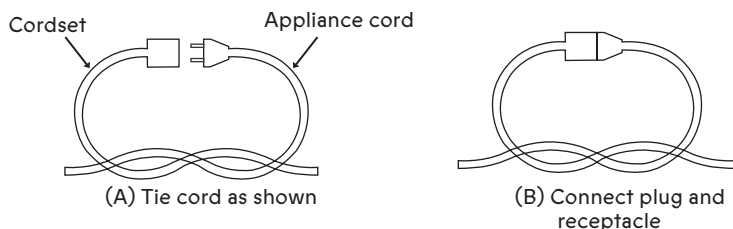

⚠ WARNING: Use a plug receptacle retaining strap to ensure a proper connection and to ensure there is no strain on the connection. A poor or strained connection can lead to sparking, voltage drop and damage to the tool, overheating, intermittent tool operation, and fire.

Avoid unintentional starting - Turn off the power switch and disconnect the power cord before making any adjustments to the unit and before inspecting, servicing, changing accessories or cleaning.

Handle cord carefully - Never pull electric tool by cord or yank it to disconnect from the power source. Keep cord away from heat, oil, and sharp edges.

Don't force electric tool - it will do the job better and with less likelihood of a risk of injury at the rate for which it was designed.

Don't overreach - Keep proper footing and balance at all times.

Stay Alert - Watch what you are doing. Use common sense. Do not operate tool when you are tired or under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or medications that cause drowsiness.

Disconnect electric tool - Disconnect the electric tool from the power supply when not in use, before servicing, when changing accessories.

Keep guards in place.

Keep hands and feet away from moving parts.

GENERAL POWER TOOL SAFETY WARNINGS

 **WARNING: Read all safety warnings and all instructions.** Failure to comply with safety instructions and instructions may cause electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

1) WORK AREA SAFETY

- a) **Keep your work area clean and well lit.** Disorder or unlit work areas can lead to accidents.
- b) **Do not operate the power tool in an explosive environment where flammable liquids, gases or dusts are present.** Power tools generate sparks that can ignite the dust or fumes.
- c) **Keep children and other persons away while using the power tool.** If distracted, you may lose control of the device.

2) ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- a) **The power tool connector must fit into the socket.** The plug must not be changed in any way. Do not use adapter plugs with grounded power tools. Unchanged plugs and suitable sockets reduce the risk of electric shock.
- b) **Avoid body contact with grounded surfaces such as pipes, heaters, stoves and refrigerators.** There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is grounded.
- c) **Keep power tools away from rain or moisture.** The penetration of water into a power tool increases the risk of electric shock.
- d) **Do not misuse the cable to carry, hang or unplug the power tool.** Keep the cable away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving equipment parts. Damaged or tangled cables increase the risk of electric shock.
- e) **If you are working with a power tool outdoors, use only extension cables that are also suitable for outdoor use.** Using an outdoor extension cable reduces the risk of electric shock.

3) PERSONAL SAFETY

4) USE AND TREATMENT OF THE POWER TOOL

- a) **Do not force the tool** – It will perform better with less likelihood of personal injury or mechanical damage if it is used at the rate for which it was designed.
- b) **Do not use a power tool whose switch is defective.** A power tool that can no longer be switched on or off is dangerous and needs to be repaired.
- c) **Disconnect the tool** – Disconnect the electric snow shovel from the power supply when it is not in use, before servicing it, when changing accessories and when performing any other maintenance task.
- d) **Store idle tool indoors** – When not in use, the electric snow shovel should be stored indoors in a dry, locked place out of the reach of children.
- e) **Maintain the electric snow shovel with care** – Follow the applicable maintenance instructions for replacing parts and changing accessories. Lubrication is not required.
- f) **Use power tools, accessories, insert tools, etc. in accordance with these instructions.** Take into account the working conditions and the job to be performed. The use of power tools for applications other than those intended can lead to dangerous situations.

SERVICE

Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.

SPECIFIC SNOW SHOVEL SAFETY RULES

 **WARNING:** Read, understand and follow all instructions on the machine and in the manual before operating this unit. Thoroughly familiarize yourself with the controls and the proper use of the equipment. Know how to stop the unit and disengage the controls quickly.

- Children should never be allowed access to the equipment. Adults should never operate the equipment without carefully reading and understanding these instructions.
- Keep the area of operation clear of all persons, particularly small children and pets.
- Exercise caution to avoid slipping or falling.
- Thoroughly inspect the area where the equipment is to be used and remove all doormats, sleds, boards, wires and other foreign objects.
- Do not operate the equipment without wearing adequate winter garments. Avoid loose fitting articles of clothing that can become caught in moving parts. Wear footwear that will improve footing on slippery surfaces.
- Do not attempt to clear snow from a gravel or crushed rock surface. This product is intended for use only on paved surfaces.
- Never attempt to make any adjustments while the motor is running (except when specifically recommended by the manufacturer).
- Always wear safety glasses or eye shields during operation or while performing an adjustment or repair to protect your eyes from foreign objects that may be thrown from the machine.
- Do not put hands or feet near or under rotating parts. Keep clear of the discharge opening at all times.
- Exercise extreme caution when operating on or crossing gravel drives, walks or roads. Stay alert for hidden hazards or traffic.
- After striking a foreign object, stop the motor. Thoroughly inspect the snow shovel for any damage, and repair the damage before restarting and operating the snow shovel.
- If the unit should start to vibrate abnormally, stop the motor and check the unit immediately to ascertain the cause vibration is generally a sign of trouble.
- Stop the motor and unplug whenever you leave the operating position, when transporting the unit, before unclogging the rotor blade housing and when making any repairs, adjustments or inspections to the unit.
- When cleaning, repairing or inspecting the snow shovel, make sure that all moving parts have come to a complete stop before beginning work.
- Exercise extreme caution when operating on slopes.
- Never operate the snow shovel without proper guards and other safety devices in place and in proper working order.
- Never direct the discharge toward people or areas where property damage can occur. Keep children, pets and other bystanders away from the work area.
- Do not overload the machine capacity by attempting to clear snow at too fast a rate.

- Look behind and use care when backing up with the snow shovel.
- Never operate the snow shovel without good visibility or light. Always be sure of your footing, and keep a firm hold on the handles. Walk, never run, with the unit.

 **WARNING:** Hand contact with the rotating auger inside the motor housing is the most common cause of injury associated with snow shovels. Never use your hands to clear a clogged motor housing.

To clear the rotor housing:

- Disconnect the power supply.
- Wait 10 seconds to be sure the auger has come to a complete stop.
- Always use a clean-out tool, not your hands, to free the rotating auger.

MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE

Check all fasteners at frequent intervals for proper tightness to ensure that the equipment is in safe working condition.

Always refer to the operator's manual for important details, such as how to properly store your snow shovel for an extended period of time.

Maintain or replace safety and instruction labels as needed.

Run the machine a few minutes after throwing snow to prevent the auger from freezing.

ASSEMBLY AND OPERATION

ASSEMBLING THE UPPER AND LOWER SHAFTS

⚠ WARNING: Always wear eye and ear protection, appropriate respiratory mask, non-slip heavy-duty gloves, and substantial footwear while operating the product. Do not operate the product when barefoot or wearing open sandals.

⚠ WARNING: Always unplug the snow shovel before making any adjustments or performing maintenance.

1. Position the Shafts

- Place the upper shaft (1) above the lower shaft (2).
- Ensure the fixing groove (3) on the lower shaft is facing the back of the shovel, as shown (Fig. 1).

2. Connect the Shafts

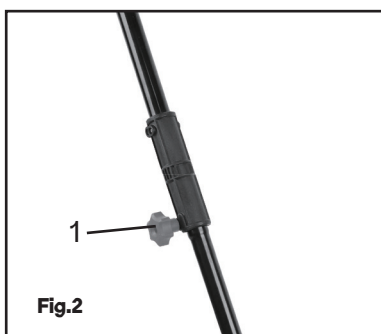
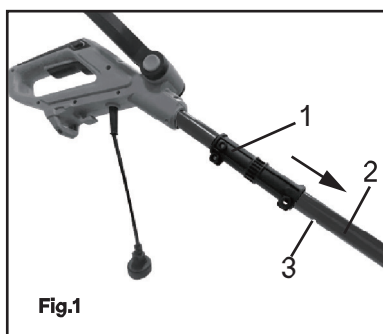
- Slide the upper shaft straight into the lower shaft. Push firmly until it is fully seated and cannot go any further.

IMPORTANT: Ensure the upper shaft is pushed in all the way so the screw hole in the upper shaft lines up with the fixing groove in the lower shaft.

- Once aligned, insert the locking screw through the screw hole in the upper shaft.

3. Secure the shafts

- Hand-tighten the shaft locking knob (1) to secure the upper and lower shafts together (Fig. 2).



ADJUSTING THE AUXILIARY HANDLE

Press and hold both auxiliary handle adjustment buttons (1) at the same time to adjust the handle position. The handle can rotate up to 180° (see Fig. 3).

Note: Do not attempt to forcefully adjust the handle by pressing only one adjustment button, as this may cause damage.

LOCK-OFF SAFETY AND ON/OFF TRIGGER SWITCHES

The snow shovel is equipped with both a lock-off safety switch and On/Off trigger switch.

To turn the snow shovel ON:

1. Press the lock-off safety switch (1) either all the way to the right or the left and hold (Fig.4).
2. While continuing to press the lock-off switch, squeeze the On/Off trigger switch (2).
3. Once the snow shovel starts, release the lock-off switch while continuing to squeeze the On/Off trigger switch. The snow shovel will continue to run while the On/Off trigger switch is squeezed.
4. To turn the snow shovel OFF, release the trigger switch.

NOTE: To restart the snow shovel, press the lock-off safety switch as instructed in instruction # 1 above and squeeze the trigger switch.

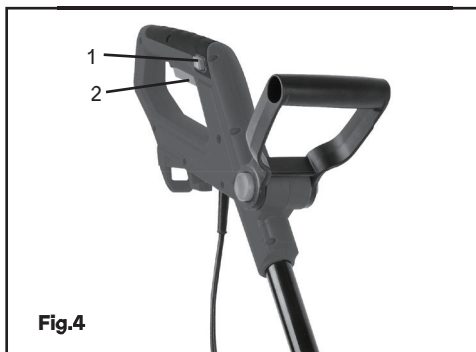

OPERATING

 **WARNING:** Always use two hands to operate the product. Hold the product with one hand on the rear handle and the other hand on the auxiliary handle.

 **WARNING:** When connecting the power supply, please keep your hands away from the lock off safety & On/Off trigger switches to avoid accidentally starting the product.

1. Connect the snow shovel to the power supply.
2. Press and hold the lock-off safety switch, and squeeze the on/off trigger to power on the tool.
3. Start the snow shovel. Push the shovel forward at a comfortable rate, yet slow enough to clear the path completely. The clearing width of the snow shovel and the depth of snowfall should dictate your forward speed.
4. Direct the snow discharge to the right or to the left by holding the snow shovel at a slight angle.
5. To remove snow most efficiently, throw the snow downwind and slightly overlap each swath.
6. This snow shovel cuts a path 12"/30.5 cm wide and up to 6"/15.2 cm deep.
7. When clearing deeper drifts, hold the snow shovel by the rear (main) and auxiliary handles and use a swinging or sweeping motion.

MAINTENANCE

GENERAL

-  **WARNING:** When servicing this tool, use only identical replacement parts. The use of any other part may create a hazard or cause product damage.

DO NOT use solvents when cleaning plastic parts. Plastics are susceptible to damage from various types of commercial solvents and may be damaged by their use. Use a clean cloth to remove dirt, dust, oil, grease etc.

-  **WARNING:** Do not allow brake fluids, gasoline, petroleum-based fluids, gasoline, petroleum-based products, penetrating oils, etc. to come into contact with plastic parts. They contain chemicals that can damage, weaken or destroy plastic.

-  **DO NOT** abuse power tools. Abusive practices can damage the tool and the workplace.

-  **WARNING:** DO NOT attempt to modify tools or create accessories. Any such alteration or modification is misuse and could result in hazardous condition leading to possible serious injury. It will also void the warranty.

LUBRICATION

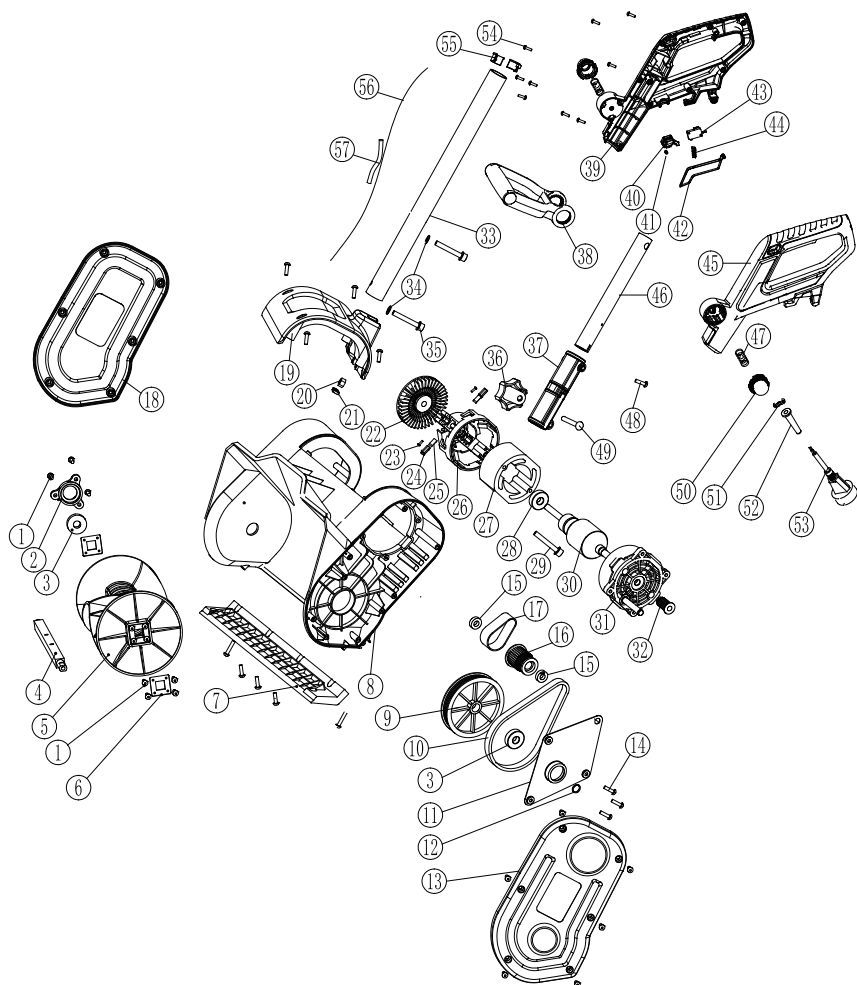
All the bearings in this tool are lubricated with sufficient amount of high-grade lubricant for the life of the unit under normal conditions. Therefore, no further lubrication is required.

Cleaning and storage

- a) Keep the handles oil-free to ensure a secure grip.
- b) If necessary, clean the appliance with a damp cloth and, if necessary, with a mild detergent.

-  Before each cleaning, switch off and unplug the device.. Never immerse the device in water or other liquids for cleaning. Keep the snow shovel in a safe and dry place and out of the reach of children.
